raised such as working against unnecessary development, improving public transport & roads, protecting the countryside, preventing fly-tipping and improving recycling opportunities.”





THIS TIME WE CAN WIN IN MEON VALLEY

For 20 years Conservatives have been elected in Meon Valley, however this looks set to change this year. At the last election in 2021, Malcolm came second with 33% of the vote. The Green vote increased by 19% following an enormous surge in support. Greens are the only viable opposition to the Conservatives in this election.

In England & Wales there are now 462 Green Councillors and, since the 2021 elections, Greens have made the largest gain of council seats in local authority by-elections of any party.

MALCOLM SAYS, "TWENTY IS PLENTY!"

CAMPAIGN STARTED FOR LOWER SPEED LIMITS

25 million people across the UK already live in residential areas where 20mph speed limits are the norm.

For the third time in 10 years, Hampshire County Council has announced plans to look at 20mph zones across the county. A group has been set-up to examine whether existing zones should remain, and which areas need the reduced speed limits.



Malcolm says, **"I receive regular feedback from residents concerned about the vehicle speeds in our villages. Research has shown that 20mph speed limits in residential areas are safer, better for the environment, affordable, have little impact on journey times and are better for communities. I will be pushing for the Council to make more progress this time!"**
