


GREENS WIN MEON VALLEY IN COUNCIL ELECTIONS RESULTS

MALCOLM WALLACE IS WINCHESTER CITY COUNCIL'S FIRST GREEN PARTY COUNCILLOR

Malcolm says: "A massive THANK YOU to voters in the Meon Valley. I'm honoured to have your trust and with this win can now get to work to make where we live fairer and greener – making life better for residents, our homes and our businesses, speaking out for a healthier planet."

In the local council elections voters showed they want change: Green Party candidates gained 78 council seats in 60 councils across the country and 23 were breakthroughs, like Winchester, where there had been no Green Party presence

before. This result takes Green Party representation in local councils to 551 - a dramatic increase shown in the graph below.


