Winchester Green Party have doubled their number of council seats from the successes in the recent local council elections. Suzanne White becomes the third Green councillor in the Central Meon Valley ward for Winchester District council. Cllr Malcolm Wallace, already a District councillor, now becomes the first elected Green on Hampshire County Council by winning the Meon Valley seat in the recent by-election. Cllr Malcolm says: "A massive thank you for all the support we have had across the Meon Valley & Whiteley. It is going to make a big difference to our local area to have Green voices on both Winchester City and Hampshire County Councils."

MEON VALLEY COUNCILLORS CONTINUE FIGHT FOR HEALTHY FRESHWATER

WATER QUALITY DATA HELPS CALL FOR ACTION ON OUR LOCAL WATERWAYS

The 'Great UK WaterBlitz' provides an important snapshot of the health of our rivers across the country from data collected by volunteers. Cllr Malcolm Wallace recently took to the water at the River Meon in Droxford to measure the water quality. Malcolm says: "Citizen science projects like this really empower people to take action by contributing to valuable research but it also helps scientists to collect data on a large scale. This testing allowed us to see first-hand the current quality of the river water in Droxford. Worryingly, our results confirmed that the river is in poor chemical health. Although results can vary depending on the conditions and seasons, it's clear that more regular monitoring is critical as this will help to drive the actions needed to clean-up our waterways." - Finance Addressing the County Council's budget gap is a critical issue. Some change is inevitable, but they need to be proportionate and the impact minimised.
- Environment The climate and nature crises are inextricably linked to our local economies, livelihoods and well-being. I will be pushing for stronger consideration of nature protection in emerging plans and strategies.
- Local Issues Key issues that you've raised with me and need backing include improving public transport & roads, improving recycling, the wastewater challenges and pushing through on infrastructure development.

NEWS IN BRIEF

FUTURE SERVICES DECISION DELAYED

Following the announcement of a General Election, Hampshire County Council decisions on future services (tip closures, road investment, etc.) have been postponed until the autumn. The review has been driven by the need to close the County Council's £132 million recurring budget gap faced from April 2025. Final decisions on the proposals are now scheduled for October.

LOCAL CYCLE & WALKING STRATEGY

The Winchester District Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) sets out the ambition for investment in walking and cycling in the District over the next 5-10 years. The draft is out for consultation until 14 July and has sections on the Whiteley core walking zone and the cycle route from Botley to Whiteley.
